

Guidelines for Application: 222 Scholarship and Mentorship Program

Partnering with 222 Foundation is truly that, a partnership. While our investment may seem financial, it is also a highly relational investment with an eternal impact.

222 Foundation provides seminary student partners with:

- 1. One-on-one mentorship with an experienced Christian leader
- 2. Scholarship awarded in the range of \$4,000 \$7,000 per year
- 3. Sponsored Holy land tour to selected Israel for graduating partners

Those best fitted for *Student Partnership* will meet most of the following criteria:

- 1. Vocational alignment:
 - a. Men preparing for pastoral ministry;
 - b. Men and Women preparing for missions, biblical counseling or other specific para-church ministry
- 2. Strong biblical worldview, complementarian view, and sincere call to ministry
- 3. Successful achievement in fidelity to the Gospel, with respect to academic endeavors involving courses in ministry;
- 4. Demonstrated financial need;
- 5. Strong desire and willingness to be mentored and develop a relationship with one of 222 mentors;
- 6. Completed at least 1st year of seminary, and have at least 4 semesters (two years) of coursework remaining prior to graduation;
- 7. Full-time, onsite, graduate level student (Th.M., M.Div. or an equivalent program).
- 8. Admission into one of the following institutions: Dallas Theological Seminary (DTS), Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (SBTS), Moody Theological Seminary (MTS), Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (TEDS)

Additionally, in order to maintain your partnership, you must:

- Take a minimum of six credit hours per term;
- Notify 222 if you drop classes, plan to take a semester break, or if additional financial aid is received after application submission, as that may affect your grant;
- Sign a Student Partnership Agreement acknowledging the parameters of the partnership; and
- Participate in key 222 Foundation functions which may include: awareness/fundraiser get-together events, representing 222 in seminary events etc.

As you consider applying, please note that the application process will entail these two steps:

- <u>Step I</u> Complete initial online application. You will be asked to share basic personal information, academic plans, work/ministry experience, vocational ministry goals and doctrinal views. Deadline for Step I application will be provided on the website.
- <u>Step II</u> (by invitation only following pre-selection from Step I) For applicants invited to complete Step II, we will ask that you:
 - o Provide financial information pertaining to your sources and uses of funds which will help us determine your financial need.
 - Provide two letters of recommendation from a current pastor or elder, and a current/former professor.
 - o Provide a short video of your faith story and ministry aspiration.
 - o Complete a personal interview with our Application Review Committee.

An Applicant whom we accept for student partnership on the basis of Step II will be advised of that acceptance, the School Term(s) covered—and the specific financial aid—no later than two months prior to the School Term to which the financial aid is going to be applied. **Application Timeline and Deadline** will be posted at **www.222foundation.org**
